I give permission for my son/daughter named above to have possession of their cellular telephone on school district property. I have read and understand the District Cellular Telephone Policy listed below and understand that my child will forfeit the right to have a cell phone on school property if they violate this policy.

Cellular Telephone Policy:

Possession of a cellular telephone by a student is a privilege, which may be forfeited by any student who fails to abide by the terms of this policy. **A student may possess a cellular telephone in school, on school property, at after school activities and at school-related functions, provided that the cell phone remains off.** Students must have a signed parent permission form on file with the school office to have the privilege to have a cell phone on school property.

Violations of this policy will result in confiscation of the cellular telephone and/or loss of the privilege to carry one. Parents will have to pick up confiscated cellular phones. The student who possesses a cellular phone shall assume all responsibility for its care. At no time shall Indian Springs School District or Frank A. Brodnicki School Staff be responsible for preventing theft, loss, or damage to cell phones brought onto school property.

CELLULAR PHONE POSSESSION AND USAGE

Cell phones are **not** to be used before the start of school, during the school day, or on school buses. All cell phones are expected to be turned off from the time a student gets on the school bus in the morning to the time that school is over in the afternoon. All cell phones are to be turned off and kept in backpacks, pockets, or purses when on a school bus. All cell phones are to be turned off and left in backpacks during the school day.

The **only** time that cell phones can be used is after school. The **only** place that cell phones can be used is outside or between the two sets of doors at the main school entrance.

CELL PHONE MISUSE AND DISCIPLINARY CONSEQUENCES

If you choose to bring a cell phone to school, you are expected to abide by the rules stated above. Consequences for violating cell phone expectations are provided below. **ONLY** the voice feature of a cell phone can be used at school – no games, cameras, video, PDA, or other features.

CELL PHONE LEFT ON IN A BACKPACK OR ON THE BUS

1ST time – Warning

2ND time – Suspension

3RD time – Confiscated and will only be returned directly to parent

4TH time – Confiscated, returned to parent directly, can no longer bring to school

Once privilege is lost, a student will be suspended from school if a cell phone is brought to school.

CELL PHONE NOT STORED AWAY DURING THE DAY PROPERLY

Cell phones must stay in the students backpack during the school day, and must be kept in a backpack, pocket, or purse while riding the school bus. If it is taken anywhere it is not supposed to be or is out on a school bus, it does not matter whether it is on or off (or rings or does not), the following will occur:

1ST time – Confiscated and will only be returned directly to parent

2ND time – Confiscated, returned to parent directly, can no longer bring to school

Once privilege is lost, a student will be suspended from school if a cell phone is brought to school
